- 3. What is gained or lost by mixing poems with stories?
- 4. How important is the South Louisiana setting to what you see as the book's main point?
- 5. Based on the way the book ends, what will become of Cassie?
- 6. What are the major challenges Cassie faces as she grows up?
- 7. Discuss the relationship between Cassie and Martha LaPlace.
- 8. How is the mother-daughter relationship resolved (or not) at the end of the book?
- 9. What importance do you give to elements of joy, play, and silliness in the book, despite its steady look at pain and death?
- 10. Why does Cassie call South Louisiana the place that put "the marrow in my bones, the arrow through my heart"?
