Begin the title a few spaces from the top of the page.

### **Author Note**

The author notes begins here and is double-spaced. The start of each paragraph is indented half an inch. Author notes are often not required for school work unless specified by your professor.

# Abstract

The abstract begins on the second page of the document. It should be a concise and complete summary of your work, probably at least three sentences. It should be a single paragraph, and the first line should *not* be indented.

Don't underline your title, put in in quotation marks, bold it or italicize it.

The actual essay or article will begin here on the third page of the document. Like the rest of the document, it should be double-spaced in Times New Roman 12 pt. font with 1" margins.

Note that the first lines of the body paragraphs are indented, unlike the abstract.
