

Your header will include your last name and the page number.

Your heading will include your name, your professor's name, the course name and number, and the date that the paper is due. Note that the date appears in day-month-year order, and that the month is abbreviated.

Title

Don't underline your title, put it in quotation marks, bold it or italicize it.

The essay is double spaced with each paragraph indented half an inch. The font should be Times New Roman, 12-point font throughout. Margins are 1 inch. Note that MLA format does not make use of a title page, though your instructor may request you create one.

Be sure to include a works cited page at the end of your document.

Citations should be ordered alphabetically and should have a hanging indent.
