Graduating senior students are administered HESI Specialty Exams and an Exit HESI Exam to determine their ability to Pass the NCLEX National Qualifying exam. It is projected that graduating seniors HESI Medical-Surgical Specialty Exam class mean should be greater than or equal to 900 (850 is identified by HESI as “acceptable” to meet the specialty exam requirement to predict success on the NCLEX Qualifying exam. Specialty exam scores from 2019-2020 showed improvement (summer 2019 mean 830 to Spring 2021 928). This has translated to improved scores on the National NCLEX Qualifying exam. In 2022 the percentage for passing first time for the class was 93% in December 2022 the percentage of graduates who passed first time was 98%. .
