A larger sample pool is necessary for meaningful evaluation. Additionally, our current Art Educator is retiring, and a new professor in Art Education will be joining Lamar University in Fall 2025. Given this transition, we do not believe it is appropriate to implement or revise any measures or actions at this time. Once the new faculty member has joined and gained at least a year of experience within our system, we will be in a better position to consider changes informed by their observations and insights. Therefore, we believe maintaining the status quo is the most appropriate course of action at this time.
