All students (100%) received advisement regarding the recommended timeframe for taking the exam, specifically between September 1 and August 31 of their fourth year. This full participation indicates successful implementation of the advisement process and ensures that every student had equal access to this essential academic planning information.

By tracking whether students are advised to take the exam between September 1 and August 31 of their fourth year, the program promotes exam readiness, reduces delays in certification, and supports on-time entry into the workforce. This measure should continue because it directly supports the overarching goal of student success, as defined by timely Praxis exam completion and pass rates.

While 100% of enrolled students participated in the assessment, 88.89% met the performance benchmark.

Evaluating student performance on a Praxis remains a critical component of exam readiness and academic assessment.

Continuing to assess this measure ensures that the program remains proactive in supporting licensure outcomes and provides a data-driven approach to curricular improvements and student advisement.

The program's 3 year Praxis exam pass rate average is 78%, as shown in the table. While the most recent year's performance (88.89%) exceeded expectations, the 3-year average fell slightly below the 80% benchmark established by the program and in alignment with CAA standards. This shortfall is primarily attributed to the cohort from one year prior, which had a pass rate of only 57.14%. Efforts are currently underway to strengthen exam preparation and provide targeted support to future cohorts to ensure consistent achievement of or surpassing the established benchmark.

Maintain Assessment Strategy

Maintaining the existing strategy allows the program to build on this momentum while continuing to monitor outcomes and support students at risk.

Additionally, the relatively small cohort sizes make year-to-year percentages sensitive to individual performance variation. Maintaining a consistent assessment approach ensures stability and fairness in measuring student achievement while allowing for ongoing enhancements based on evidence and feedback.

This includes competency in the targeted areas of Prevention and Screening (2B) and Audiologic Evaluation (2C). Achieving full compliance with the 90% benchmark indicates strong alignment between clinical training objectives and student performance. This outcome affirms that the program is effectively cultivating core professional competencies essential to the practice of audiology. Continued monitoring of this measure will help ensure sustained performance and inform any future refinements to clinical instruction or competency evaluation tools.
