

Department of Biology Post-tenure Review Guidelines

<u>Procedure</u>: Each tenured faculty member will complete the Tenure Performance Review Form (TPRF) below annually and submit it with their F2.08 to the Chair for record keeping. During the review year, the TPRFs from the preceding five years will be reviewed by the tenured faculty. The tenured faculty will vote on whether the faculty member under review has met the minimum standards of performance.

<u>Requirement</u>: Each tenured faculty member needs to complete at least 5-6 teaching, service, and research activities each year to meet the Biology Departments minimum standards. The departmental expectation is that faculty will complete at least one activity annually from each of the three areas over the five-year evaluation period. If deemed necessary by the faculty member, appropriate activities not appearing on the form may also be listed. In addition, the teaching portion of F2.08 must average at least 3 out of 5 over the five-year post-tenured review period.
