PROGRAM LEADERSHIP OPPORTUNITIES

EXCLUSIVE COURSE OFFERINGS

• Students in the program enroll in a unique multidisciplinary set of courses, focusing on the development of leadership and critical thinking skills through a curriculum taught by select faculty. From the first year on campus to the senior thesis, students in this program will have opportunities to engage in leadership development opportunities that will inspire deep learning and prepare them for career success.

ALUMNI MENTOR PROGRAM
