Honors Researchers Share Summer Projects at SURF Symposium

We enjoyed learning from our Reaud Honors student researchers who shared their SURF Fellow research projects:

- Nirbhik Neupane worked with mentor Dr. Rakibul Islam to develop a smart, automated tool using LLMs and RAG to make it easier for app developers to understand and fix problems reported by users in app store reviews.
- Priya Rathore researched "Bioremediation of Industrial Mine Wastewaters using *Galdieria Sulphuraria*" under mentor Dr. Thinesh Selvaratnam.
- Ryan Servantes teamed up with mentor Dr. Jim Armacost to study diseased ducks this summer to try to determine a "Correlation Between Humans and Angel Wing Syndrome in Ducks."
- Guided by mentor Dr. Yan Yan, Mackenzie Howell explored the effects of elementary children's screen time on the sociometric status of students.

























Honors Researchers Offer Advice to Future URG Grantees


