Calendar of Critical Dates

June

13 Dual Credit application deadline. **ALL** applications, course registration request forms, and transcripts must be submitted to the university by 5 p.m.

August

- 1 Final document deadline. All test scores (from summer entrance exams) must be in to the university by 5 p.m.
- 15 First payment deadline. Partial (half of balance) payment must be made to prevent being dropped.
- 22 First class day

September

- **06** Labor Day holiday
- **12** Final payment deadline students who have not paid account balances will be dropped.
- 19 Last day to drop without academic penalty

Tuition Information

- Reduced rate tuition for dual credit students in the Online program is \$133 per credit hour or \$399 for a 3 hour course. However, a dual credit scholarship will be applied that lowers dual credit course costs to \$150 for a 3-hour course and \$200 for a 4-hour course. These scholarships are automatically generated and applied to students' accounts no scholarship applications are necessary.
- Incentive for Exemplary Grades: Students who earn final grades of A's or B's in their Fall 2022 dual credit courses will receive a discount on tuition for Spring 2023 dual credit courses. A final grade of an A or B in a Fall dual credit course will result in a 50% tuition reduction in a Spring dual credit course. This is a course-for-course incentive, and the financial benefits of this incentive are only applicable to the subsequent Spring semester and will not carry over to future Summer, Fall, or Spring semesters.
- Students who do not pay at least half of their tuition by the first payment deadline (August 15) will be dropped from courses.
